In your letter of inquiry and “Request to Access a Government Record,” you stated interest in the process by which an individual can “opt out of the Native Hawaiian Roll Commission’s list, or how to remove a person’s name from the Roll Commission’s list.

At the Kanaiolowalu website: www.kanaiolowalu.org, a person may check the registry, by entering their name and date of birth and click on “check status.” This action will confirm whether their name is on the list. Then, if you take the next step, to remove your name from the list, go to the tab at the top of the website and click on “ABOUT” and select “frequently asked questions,” and there you will find information to opt out either online or by mail.
