Re: Amendment to Request Under Freedom of Information Act

To Whom It May Concern:

The American Civil Liberties Union of Northern California, American Civil Liberties Union of Hawaii, and the American Civil Liberties Union of Utah (together, “ACLU”)¹ write in reference to their Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”) request dated February 2, 2017 (“Request”) for records about the implementation of President Trump’s January 27, 2017 Executive Order (“Executive Order”) by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (“CBP”).

The Request asks for various Records² concerning CBP’s understanding and implementation of the Executive Order at various airports and port of entry offices. The ACLU is writing to amend and expand its Request to include the Kona International Airport as one of the Local
